

LEADERSHIP FORUM HIGHLIGHTS

21CLub@Kendrick High School (Muscogee County) hosted a leadership forum called "Employability Forum"

- 60 students attended the forum
- 3 professionals spoke about common employment mistakes and how to deal with on job issues.





21CLub@Charles R. Drew High School (Clayton County) hosted a Leadership Forum called "Financial Literacy" on February 2, 2025

- **65 students** were in attendance, along with Personal Finance teachers.
- The forum addressed the many financial decisions and pitfalls that high school students, college students and recent graduates must navigate.
- A financial institution representative and real estate agent presented and participated in a Q & A discussion.

21CLub@Dunwoody High School hosted a Leadership Forum on March 5, 2025.

- 23 students were in attendance for the panel, dinner, and dessert.
- 5 Noble Investment volunteers served on a panel and hosted a Q&A session
- The club provided raffles for gift cards for all students who attended

21CLub@Carver (Muscogee County) hosted a service project that was held March 3, 2025 at Downtown Elementary serving 140 students.

- **14** members participated in Read Across America by reading to students in Pre-K through 5th grade.
- They visited **8** different classes: 1 Pre-K; 1- 1st grade; 2-2nd grade; 2-3rd grade; 1-4th grade; 1-5th grade.
- Each teacher received a book donated by the 21CLub to add to their classroom library.

21CLub@Harris County hosted a food drive and made lunch sacks for their local food banks, FOCUS ,throughout **January 2025**. They:

- Collected over **3,000** items
- Made **150** lunch sacks for the local kids when they are out of school.
- Donated leftovers to FOCUS in addition to the lunch sacks.
- Around **200** people donated and around **20** students helped to pack the sacks.

STEM+21CLub@Fulton County Innovation Academy organized a service project known as Earth Month Awareness on **April 25 - April 30, 2025.**

- They hosted an online service project including informational videos about the importance of climate change, sustainability, resource depletion, and pollution.
- 20 students participated in this initiative.

21CLub@Pickens County Community hosted a service project on September 18, 2024.

- 12 students were involved and 35 senior citizens were impacted.
- They volunteered at the Pickens Senior Center to help with Bingo.
